Patient Preferred Pharmacy

- Adding a pharmacy to the patient record facilitates the discharge process
- The information will remain on the patient's record across encounters
 - ~ Verify the patient pharmacy at each admission.
 - ~ If this is the patient's first visit since go live or if the patient has switched pharmacies use the following process to enter the information.

- Open a chart from the PAL, Patient List or MPTL
- Click the Patient Preferred Pharmacy button to launch the Patient Pharmacy window.

- If the patients pharmacy is listed:
 - ~ Right-click and click the Add button
- If it isn't listed or the list is too long:
 - ~ Add further information such as Pharmacy Name or Zip Code
 - ~ Click Search
 - ~ Select the pharmacy the list
 - ~ Right-click and click the Add button

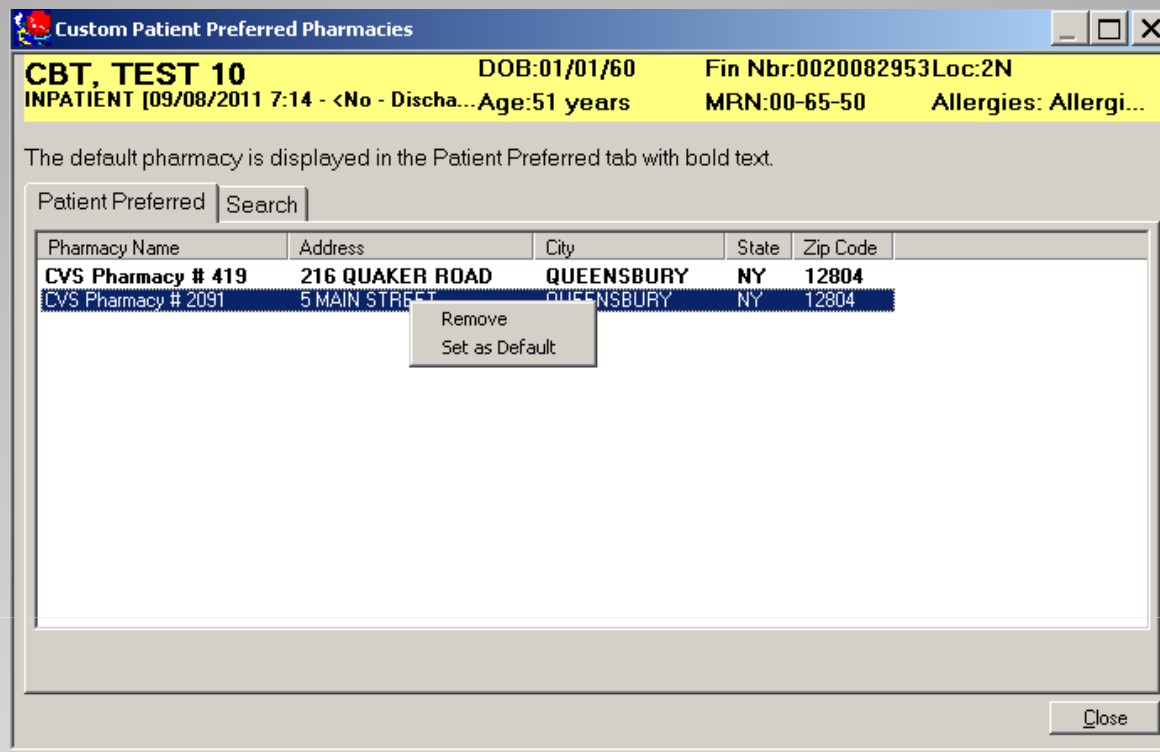

- The selected Pharmacy will now display in the Patient Preferred window as the default Pharmacy.
- More than one Pharmacy may be added to the list.
- As each new Pharmacy is added, it will become the default Pharmacy and will appear at the top of the list.



- A right click on a Pharmacy in the Patient Preferred list will allow you to either remove it from the list or set it as the Default.

Remember: The first pharmacy in the list is considered the default pharmacy.
